Subject: Southeast Alabama Works (SAW) Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) Adult Eligibility

Due to Southeast Alabama's low unemployment rate and the need for skilled workers to meet the growing demand in advanced manufacturing, the income limit for Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) Adult eligibility in the Southeast Alabama Works Local Area has increased. Effective immediately, the 150% Lower Living Standard Income Level (LLSIL) will be used to determine Adult eligibility. The income limit for WIOA Youth subject to low income requirements remains at 70% LLSIL.

The 150% Lower Living Standard Income Level Chart separated into Metropolitan and Non-Metropolitan Areas is below. To determine eligibility, staff will first determine the applicant's family size (per WIOA definition), the applicant's county of residence (listed as Metropolitan or Non-Metropolitan) then use the appropriate chart for the income limit.

Metropolitan Areas: Geneva, Henry, and Houston Counties
